STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT for the protection of trout and land-locked
salmon in Kennebago and Rangely chain of lakes
and streams.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. No person shall take, catch, kill,
2 fish for or destroy any trout or land-locked salmon
3 in the Kennebago, Rangely, Cupsuptic, Moose-
4 loemaguntic, Mollychunkamunk and Welokenne-
5 bacook lakes, or in the streams flowing into or con-
6 necting said lakes, during the months of February,
7 March and April of each year.

SECT. 2. No person shall use spawn as bait for
2 fishing in any of the waters named in the fore-
3 going section during the month of September of
4 each year.

SECT. 3. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars for the attempt, and one dollar for each and every trout or land-locked salmon so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be recovered by complaint before any trial justice, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the town where the complaint is made.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
