STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT explanatory of section three, of chapter seventy-eight, of laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, relating to tramps.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The words "all costs to be paid by the state," in

- 2 the fifth line of section three of said act, shall be
- 3 construed to mean costs and expenses incurred,
- 4 under the provisions of said act.
