STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend item fifth of section twenty-four
of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, relating to
powers and obligations of school districts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Item fifth of section twenty-four of chapter eleven
2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out the words "if they find it practicable" in
4 said item, and inserting instead thereof the words
5 "and the schools shall commence and continue as
6 voted by the district, unless in the opinion of the
7 superintending school committee or supervisor, it
8 would be detrimental to the best interests of the
9 district, on account of any contagious disease or

10 other good reason," so that said item, as amended,
11 shall read as follows:

12 *Fifth*—To instruct the superintending school
13 committee or supervisor at what time the schools
14 shall commence; and the schools shall commence
15 and continue as voted by the district, unless in the
16 opinion of the superintending school committee or
17 supervisor, it would be detrimental to the best in-
18 terests of the district, on account of any contagious
19 disease or other good reason.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
