STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Oxford and Androscoggin Telegraph Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Rufus Prince, O. H. Hersey, S. C.

- 2 Andrews, Israel Washburn, jr., George C. Wing,
- 3 George D. Bisbee, R. C. Thomas, Jason Farrar,
- 4 their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby
- 5 created a body politic, by the name of the Oxford
- 6 and Androscoggin Telegraph Company, with all
- 7 the powers, rights and privileges, and subject to
- 8 all the duties and obligations granted and pre-
- 9 scribed by the general laws of this state, relating 10 to corporations.
 - Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized 2 to own, construct, maintain and operate a line or

- 3 lines of telegraph and a line or lines of telephone, 4 from the town of Buckfield, in the county of 5 Oxford, through any intervening town or towns in 6 Oxford or Androscoggin counties, to any point in 7 the city of Auburn or city of Lewiston, in the 8 county of Androscoggin, upon and along any 9 public highway, railroad, bridge or private lands, 10 but in such manner as not to incommode or endan-11 ger the customary public use thereof, with the 12 right to cut down trees and remove obstacles when
- 14 mental or shade trees, and with the power to 15 establish and collect tolls on said line or lines.

 Sect. 3. If the land of any individual or cor-2 poration is taken under this act, and the parties

13 necessary within the limits aforesaid, except orna-

- 2 poration is taken under this act, and the parties 3 cannot agree on the damages occasioned thereby, 4 they shall be estimated, secured and paid in the 5 manner provided in case of land taken for rail-6 roads.
- SECT. 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized 2 and empowered to connect its line or lines with 3 those of any other telegraph or telephone company 4 or corporation, or to sell or loan its line or lines 5 of telegraph and property and telephone and property, either before or after completion, to any other 7 telegraph or telephone company or corpor a

- 8 upon such terms as may be mutually agreed upon,
- 9 which sale or lease shall be binding upon the par-
- 10 ties, or may purchase or lease any other line or lines
- 11 of telegraph or telephone upon such terms and
- 12 conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.
 - Sect. 5. The capital stock of said corporation
 - 2 shall be of such amount as said corporation may
 - 3 from time to time determine to be necessary, for
 - 4 the sole purpose of owning, constructing, main-
 - 5 taining and operating the line or lines of telegraph
 - 6 or telephone hereby authorized or contemplated,
 - 7 and said corporation may purchase, hold, sell and
 - 8 convey all real and personal property necessary
 - 9 for the purposes contemplated in this charter.
 - Sect. 6. The two first corporators named in
 - 2 this act, may call the first meeting of the corpora-
 - 3 tion by mailing a written notice signed by both,
 - 4 postage paid, to each of the other corporators,
 - 5 seven days at least before the day of the meeting,
 - 6 naming the time, place and purposes of such meet-
 - 7 ing, and at such meeting a president, secretary,
 - 8 treasurer and directors may be chosen, by-laws
 - 9 adopted, and any corporate business transacted.
 - SECT. 7. This act shall take effect on its ap-2 proval.
