STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT relating to the Maine Central Institute.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The trustees of the Maine Central 2 Institute shall have the power at any time after the 3 passage of this act to strike out the words "the 4 Maine Central," before the word "Institute," and 5 insert the surname of any person who may give the 6 institute at least the sum of ten thousand dollars.

SECT. 2. In case the buildings and grounds of the 2 said institute shall not be free from debt in two 3 years from the passage of this act, the said trus-4 tees shall have the power to locate the said insti-5 tute in some town or city in this state whose in-6 habitants may furnish it with suitable buildings 7 and grounds free from any expense to the said in-

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8 stitute. *Provided*, that said institute shall not be 9 removed to any town where a normal school is 10 located.

SECT. 3. The resolve in favor of the Maine Cen-2 tral institute, approved March twelve, eighteen 3 hundred and seventy, and amended by the resolve 4 approved March one, eighteen hundred and seventy-5 nine, is hereby further amended by striking out the 6 words "school property to the amount of forty thou-7 sand dollars," and inserting the words "suitable 8 buildings and grounds," so that said resolve as 9 amended shall read as follows:

10 Resolved, That the sum of ten thousand dollars 11 be and hereby is appropriated out of the state treas-12 ury for the use of the trustees of the Maine Central 13 institute, as endowment fund to said institution, the 14 money to be retained in the treasury, and the inter-15 est to be paid semi-annually, till the year one thou-16 sand eight hundred and eighty-five; and if at that 17 time the said trustees shall own unincumbered suit-18 able buildings and grounds, equal invalue to its build-19 ings and grounds at Pittsfield, in case of removal, 20 and the said institution shall be in successful opera-21 tion, the said sum of ten thousand dollars shall be 22 paid to the trustees of said institution for the use 23 and benefit thereof; and they shall safely invest the

24 same, the interest only to he expended annually; 25 *provided*, that the trustees of said institution, in 26 consideration of the aid thus rendered by the state, 27 shall, within one year after the passage of this re-28 solve, establish and thereafter maintain a normal 29 department for the preparation of teachers.

SECT. 4. This act shall be in force when approved 2 by the governor, and accepted by the said trus-3 tees.
