STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section forty-four, chapter fortynine of the revised statutes, and to require the insurance commissioner to give bond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section forty-four, chapter forty-nine of the re-

- 2 vised statutes is hereby amended, by striking out
- 3 all after the word sections, in the fifth line, to and
- 4 including the word council, in the ninth line, and
- 5 adding at the end of said section the following
- 6 words: "and shall keep an accurate account of
- 7 all fees received from said companies and brokers
- 8 for licenses, and settle the same annually with the
- 9 governor and council, and if they amount to more
- 10 than twelve hundred dollars a year, exclusive of all

- 11 expenses, he shall pay the balance into the treasury
- 12 of the state, and shall give bond to the treasurer in
- 13 the sum of five thousand dollars, for the faithful
- 14 discharge of his duties," so that said section when
- 15 amended shall read as follows:
- 16 Sect. 44. An insurance commissioner shall be
- 17 appointed by the governor and council, who shall
- 18 hold his office three years, unless sooner removed,
- 19 but shall not at the same time be examiner of
- 20 banks. He shall have no compensation for his
- 21 official services, except the fees prescribed in the
- 22 following sections. He may administer oaths in
- 23 the performance of his official duties, in any part
- 24 of the state, and at any time. He shall keep a cor-
- 25 rect account of all his doings, and of all matters
- 26 relating to the subject of insurance and insurance
- 27 companies, on which he is officially called to act,
- 28 and shall keep an accurate account of all fees
- 29 received from said companies and brokers for
- 30 licenses, and settle the same annually with the
- 31 governor and council; and if they amount to more
- 32 than twelve hundred dollars, exclusive of all post-
- 33 age expenses, he shall pay the balance into the
- 34 treasury of the state, and shall give bond to the
- 35 treasurer in the sum of five thousand dollars, for
- 36 the faithful discharge of his duties.
