STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section five, of chapter one hundred and seven, of the revised statutes, relating to depositions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section five, of chapter one hundred and seven, 2 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by sub- 3 stituting in place of the word "the," the word 4 "any" in the second line of said section, and after 5 the word "deponant," to insert the words "except 6 the adverse party," so that said section as amended 7 would read as follows:

8 *Sect. 5.* On application of either party to a 9 justice of the peace or notary public, he may issue 10 a summons to any deponant, except the adverse 11 party, to appear at a designated time and place,

12 to give his deposition, and a notice to the adverse
13 party to be then and there present; and the depo-
14 sition may then and there be taken by him, or any
15 other justice or notary.
