STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to enable certain towns to aid in the construction of the Boothbay Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The towns of Boothbay, Edgecomb,

- 2 New Castle and Damariscotta, or any of them
- 3 through which the Boothbay Railroad may be
- 4 built, are hereby authorized and employed at any
- 5 legal meeting thereof called for that purpose, any
- 6 time after the approval of this act, by a two-thirds
- 7 vote to guaranty the interest on any bonds issued
- 8 by the Boothbay Railroad Company for the con-
- 9 struction of its road from tide waters in said
- 10 Boothbay, to the Knox and Lincoln Railroad
- 11 under the charter granted by the legislature of
- 12 1881, or on such portion of the road or bonds and

- 13 to such an amount of interest as they may pre14 scribe in their vote. *Provided*, *however*, that none
 15 of said towns shall incur, under the provisions of
 16 this act, an indebtedness or liability which together
 17 with the prior indebtedness or liability of such
 18 town shall exceed five per cent. of its next preced19 ing valuation.
 - Sect. 2. Any town that shall guarranty interest 2 in the manner aforesaid shall be secured therefor 3 by said railroad company by mortgage of its fran-4 chise, road, and property connected therewith, sub-5 ject to any prior mortgages, or in such other 6 manner as the directors of said company and such 7 towns may agree upon.
