STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter fifty-eight, section ten of the revised statutes, relating to agricultural societies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section ten of chapter fifty-eight, of the revised

- 2 statutes is hereby amended by adding to said sec-
- 3 tion the following words, "and the Ossipee Valley
- 4 Union Agricultural Society shall receive as much
- 5 as raised by it, not exceeding two hundred dollars;
- 6 and the same shall be deducted from the sums
- 7 allowed to the counties of York, Oxford and Cum-
- 8 berland, in proportion to the number of inhabitants
- 9 of each county within the limits of said society," so
- 10 that said section shall read as follows:

11 Sect. 10. The treasurer of an incorporated agri-12 cultural or horticultural society, on application made 13 prior to the first Wednesday of December in each 14 year, shall be entitled to receive from the state treas-15 ury a sum equal to that raised by such society in the 16 year next preceding; but not exceeding one cent to 17 each inhabitant of the county where such society 18 is located, according to the last preceding national 19 census, nor more than four hundred dollars to one 20 county. If there is more than one such society 21 in any county, and the sums so applied for exceed 22 the limit aforesaid, it shall be paid to each in pro-23 portion to the amount expended by it as herein-24 after provided. But the Penobscot and Aroostook 25 union agricultural society may annually receive as 26 much as raised by it, not exceeding one hundred 27 dollars, without regard to population; and the 28 Waldo and Penobscot agricultural society as much 29 as raised by it, not exceeding a hundred and thirty 30 dollars; and the same shall be deducted from the 31 sums allowed to the counties of Waldo and Penob-32 scot in proportion to the number of inhabitants 33 of each county within the limits of said society. 34 And the Ossipee Valley union agricultural society 35 shall receive as much as raised by it, not exceed-36 ing two hundred dollars, and the same shall be

- 37 deducted from the sums allowed to the counties of
- 38 York, Oxford and Cumberland, in proportion to
- 39 the number of inhabitants of each county within
- 40 the limits of said society.
