No. 109.

We, a Minority of the Committee on Apportionment, for Senators and Representatives, cannot assent to the majority report, for the reason that it is manifestly unjust to the counties of Waldo and Somerset, as compared with other counties, in relation to Senatorial representation. And also that the rule generally applied was disregarded in not observing and adopting the report of County delegations, in the County of Penobscot. That instead of respecting the report of sixteen of that delegation, including all her Senators, that only five of that delegation favored the report adopted by a majority committee.
