STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES to correct a clerical error in the state valuation of township number seven, range eleven, Piscataquis county, and for the abatement and re-funding of the taxes assessed thereon.

Resolved, That the state valuation of eighteen
2 hundred and eighty-one, of township number seven,
3 range eleven, Piscataquis county, be and hereby is
4 amended by striking out the sum of twenty-eight
5 thousand, eight hundred and three dollars, (\$28,803)
6 and inserting therefor twenty-two thousand, eight
7 hundred and three dollars, (\$22,803) and that here-
8 after the state and county taxes be assessed upon
9 the valuation of twenty-two thousand eight
10 hundred and three dollars, (\$22,803.)

Resolved, That the state treasurer be required to
2 abate and refund to the owners of township

3 number seven, range eleven, Piscataquis county,
4 twenty-seven dollars, (\$27) of the state tax, and
5 six dollars and eighty-five cents, (\$6.85) of the
6 county tax for the years of eighteen hundred and
7 eighty-one, and eighteen hundred and eighty-two.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be required to
2 withhold six dollars and eighty-five cents, (\$6.85)
3 from the county of Piscataquis, it being the amount
4 of county tax of said county refunded as above.

Statement of Facts to accompany House Bill No. 35.

Upon petition of S. H. Blake of Bangor, the Committee on Finance have examined into the valuation of Township 7, Range 11, Piscataquis county as made by the Valuation Committee in 1881, and find that the number of acres in said town as taxed upon is six thousand more than the town contains, and beyond doubt it is a clerical error, and the tax upon that number of acres should be refunded.
