STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Presque Isle academy.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be and is hereby 2 directed to pay to the treasurer of Presque Isle 3 academy, the sum of three thousand dollars being 4 the amount appropriated for the use and benefit of 5 said academy, by a resolve approved March twenty-6 second, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, said sum 7 to be paid by treasurer when it shall appear to the 8 satisfaction of the governor and council by the cer-9 tificate of said treasurer that a sum not less than 10 eight thousand dollars has been expended on school 11 buildings in town of Presque Isle, and that the 12 annual interest required to be paid by said resolve 13 of March twenty-second, eighteen hundred and 14 sixty-four, shall not be paid after the payment of 15 the aforesaid sum, three thousand dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

By Resolve approved March 22, 1864, it was provided "that the State Treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay to the Trustees of Presque Isle Academy, the sum of three thousand dollars, for the use and benefit of said academy, from the funds arising from the sale of timber and lumber, under a resolve of the present Legislature appropriating the timber and lumber of a township of land for educational purposes, said sum to be deposited in the treasury of the State, the annual interest to be paid annually to the trustees of said academy." The said trustees now ask that the sum so provided, may be paid over to them to be devoted, with other funds to them accruing from sale of property now in their possession, to the establishment of a first-class academy or seminary.
