STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of Oak Grove Seminary.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars
2 annually, for four years, be paid from the state
3 treasury to the managers and overseers of Oak
4 Grove Seminary, in aid of said seminary, of which
5 there shall be paid the sum of three hundred dollars
6 during the year one thousand eight hundred eighty-
7 three, three hundred dollars during the year one
8 thousand eight hundred eighty-four, three hundred
9 dollars during the year one thousand eight hundred
10 eighty-five, and three hundred dollars during the
11 year one thousand eight hundred eighty-six.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Legislature of the State of Maine:

The writer having visited "Oak Grove Seminary" frequently during the years he was Supervisor of Schools of Vassalboro', feels an earnest interest therein, as it gives many pupils an opportunity of preparing themselves for teachers, college, and business life, not only from this town but adjoining towns, that could not attend other schools. The locality and spacious buildings give students the privilege of self-boarding, thus making it one of those schools that the State cannot afford to have discontinued.
