IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-THREE.

---

AN ACT entitled an act to amend section three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, relating to bowling alleys and billiard rooms.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised  
2 statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, is  
3 hereby amended by inserting the words "pool,"  
4 "bagatelle," after the word alley in the first line of  
5 said section, so that said section as amended shall  
6 read as follows: No person shall keep a bowling  
7 alley, pool, bagatelle, or billiard room without a  
8 license, under a penalty of ten dollars for each day  
9 such alley or room shall be so kept, to be recovered.

10 upon complaint before a judge of a municipal or  
11 police court or trial justice, or by indictment to the  
12 use of the person prosecuting.
