STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe of Indians for the years eighteen hundred and eighty-three and eighteen hundred and eighty-four.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to the agent of the Penobscot Indians, to be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe, each year as follows:

Forty-four hundred twenty-nine dollars and seventy cents, amount of interest on their trust fund held by the state for the benefit of said tribe; seventeen hundred dollars for their annual annuity each year; seven hundred dollars for agricultural purposes each year; four hundred and fifty dollars for bounty on crops each year; two hundred dollars for salary of agent for each year; one

13 hundred and fifty dollars to pay a competent
14 person to instruct and assist said Indians in their
15 agricultural labors each year; six hundred dollars
16 for schools' each year, to be used in employing
17 competent teachers, viz: four hundred dollars for
18 Oldtown island, under the supervision of the
19 agent of said tribe and resident priest; seventy-five
20 dollars on Olamon island, under the supervision of
21 the superintending school committee of Greenbush;
22 one hundred and twenty-five dollars on Mattanaw-
23 cook island, under the supervision of the superin-
24 tending school committee of Lincoln; and said
25 committees are required to report as directed in
26 resolve approved March seventeen, eighteen hun-
27 dred and sixty, and it shall be the duty of said
28 agent to see that the money is fully expended for
29 the education of the children of the tribe; one
30 hundred dollars for the salary of said priest for
31 each year; *provided*, he says mass at least twenty-
32 four Sundays during the year, for said tribe of
33 Indians; fifty dollars for salary of their governor
34 each year; thirty dollars for salary of their lieuten-
35 ant governor each year; three hundred dollars for
36 repairs on chapel in full for the years eighteen

37 hundred and eighty-three and eighteen hundred
38 and eighty-four; all the foregoing sums to be
39 expended under the direction of the governor and
40 council.
