STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of
government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. In order to provide for the several
2 acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the
3 payment of money from the treasury, and also to
4 provide for the necessary expenditures of govern-
5 ment for the current fiscal year of eighteen
6 hundred and eighty-three, the following sums are
7 hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the
8 treasury, and the governor, with the advice and
9 consent of the council, is authorized at any time
10 prior to the first day of January next, to draw his
11 warrant on the treasurer for the same:
