STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to apportion one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes, in the State of Maine.

Resolved, That for the sixty-second legislature, and the 2 succeeding legislatures to and including that of the year 3 one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, the County of 4 Androscoggin shall choose eleven representatives, to be 5 apportioned as follows, to wit :

6 The County of Androscoggin shall choose eleven repre- 7 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows : Lewiston, four ; 8 Auburn, two ; Turner and Livermore, one ; East Liver- 9 more, Leeds and Greene, one ; Lisbon and Webster, one ; 10 Minot and Durham, one ; Poland and Wales, one.

The County of Aroostook shall choose ten representa- 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows : Linneus, number 3 eleven range one, Amity, Orient, Weston, Bancroft, 4 Haynesville, Oakfield, Glenwood, Reed, Barker, number 5 three, number four range three, and all other unorganized 6 townships in ranges two and one, one ; Houlton and 7 Hodgdon, one ; Presque Isle, Maysville, Washburn, 8 Mapleton, Chapman and Westfield, one ; Monticello, 9 Bridgewater, Blaine, Littleton, New Limerick, Ludlow, 10 letter B range two, letter C range two, letter D range 11 two, and letter E range two, one ; Fort Fairfield, Easton 12 and Mars Hill, one ; Caribou, Woodland, Perham and

13 New Sweden, one; Saint Francis, all unincorporated
 14 places above Saint Francis, Saint Johns, Fort Kent, New
 15 Canada, Wallagrass, Eagle Lake, Portage Lake, Sheridan,
 16 Castle Hill, Wade, Nashville, all townships west of range
 17 seven, number thirteen, fourteen range five, numbers four-
 18 teen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen range six, and numbers
 19 nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen range
 20 seven, one; Grand Isle, Van Buren, Cyr plantation,
 21 Hamlin plantation, Caswell plantation, Limestone planta-
 22 tion, Connor, and number sixteen and seventeen range
 23 three, one; Frenchville, Madawaska, numbers fifteen, six-
 24 teen, seventeen range four, numbers fifteen, sixteen and
 25 seventeen range five, one; Sherman, Benedicta, Silver
 26 Ridge, number one range five, Molunkus, Macwahoc,
 27 Island Falls, Dyer Brook, Merrill, Smyrna, Masardis,
 28 Ashland, number eleven range six, Oxbow, numbers
 29 seven, eight, nine range five, Moro, Hersey, Crystal,
 30 numbers one, two, three, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven
 31 range four, numbers six, seven, eight, nine, ten range
 32 three, and number ten range six, one.

The County of Cumberland shall choose twenty repre-
 2 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows: Portland, five;
 3 Cape Elizabeth, one; Westbrook, one; Deering, one,
 4 Brunswick, one; Gorham, one; Bridgton, one; Wind-
 5 ham, one; Pownal and Freeport, one; Harrison, Otisfield
 6 and Casco, one; Baldwin and Standish, one; Gray and
 7 New Gloucester, one; Falmouth and Cumberland, one;
 8 Raymond, Naples and Sebago, one; Yarmouth and North
 9 Yarmouth, one; Scarborough for the years eighteen hun-
 10 dred and eighty-five and eighteen hundred and eighty-
 11 nine, one; Harpswell for the years eighteen hundred and
 12 eighty-seven and eighteen hundred and ninety-one, one;
 13 Harpswell shall choose one in the years eighteen hundred
 14 and eighty-six and eighteen hundred and ninety, if, by
 15 reason of an amendment of the constitution, annual and
 16 regular sessions of the legislature shall be held in those
 17 years; and Scarborough shall choose one in eighteen

18 hundred and eighty-eight, if, for the same reason, such
 19 session shall be held in that year.

The County of Franklin shall choose four representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows: Jay, Chesterfield,
 3 Wilton and Carthage, one; Farmington and New Sharon,
 4 one; Avon, Strong, Phillips, Weld, Temple, Perkins'
 5 plantation, Washington plantation, number six plantation,
 6 letter E plantation, one; Industry, New Vineyard, Free-
 7 man, Salem, Kingfield, Eustis, Madrid, Rangeley, Range-
 8 ly plantation, Dallas plantation, Greenvale plantation,
 9 Coplin plantation, and all other territory in Franklin
 10 county not included in any other district, one.

The County of Hancock shall choose nine representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows: Ellsworth, one;
 3 Bucksport and Verona, one; Orland, Castine and Brooks-
 4 ville, one; Bluehill, Surrey and Dedham, one; Mt.
 5 Desert, Eden, Tremont and Cranberry Isle, one; Deer
 6 Isle, Swan Isle, and all other islands in said county not
 7 included in any other district, one; Gouldsborough, Sul-
 8 livan, Franklin, Eastbrook, and townships and plantations
 9 numbers seven, eight, nine, ten and twenty-one, one;
 10 Trenton, Lamoine, Hancock, Waltham, Mariaville, Otis,
 11 Amherst, Aurora, plantation number thirty-three, and all
 12 other plantations and townships not included in any other
 13 district, one; Penobscot, Sedgewick, Brooklin and Long
 14 Island, one.

The County of Kennebec shall choose thirteen repre-
 2 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows: Augusta, two;
 3 Gardiner, one; Waterville, one; Hallowell, one, Win-
 4 throp, Belgrade and Rome, one; Readfield, Fayette,
 5 Vienna and Mount Vernon, one; Litchfield, Monmouth
 6 and Wayne, one; West Waterville, Sidney and Manches-
 7 ter, one; Pittston, West Gardiner and Farmingdale, one;
 8 Clinton, Benton and Winslow, one; China, Albion,
 9 Chelsea and Unity plantation, one; Vassalboro' and
 10 Windsor, one.

The County of Knox shall choose eight representatives, 2 to be apportioned as follows: Camden, one; Rockland, 3 two; Thomaston, Matinicus Isle plantation and Muscle 4 Ridge plantation, one; St. George, Cushing and Friend- 5 ship, one; South Thomaston, Vinalhaven, North Haven 6 and Hurricane Isle, one; Washington, Appleton and 7 Hope, one; Warren and Union, one.

The County of Lincoln shall choose six representatives, 2 to be apportioned as follows: Bristol and Damariscotta, 3 one; Boothbay and Southport, one; Dresden, Wiscasset, 4 Edgecomb and Westport, one; Alna, Newcastle, Noble- 5boro' and Somerville, one; Jefferson, Whitefield and 6 Bremen, one; Waldoboro', Monhegan and Muscongus, 7 one.

The County of Oxford shall choose seven representatives 2 to be apportioned as follows: Norway, Oxford and 3 Hebron, one; Paris, Buckfield and Milton, one; Hiram, 4 Fryeburg, Stow' and Lovell, one; Porter, Brownfield, 5 Denmark, Waterford and Sweden, one; Hartford, Sum- 6ner, Canton, Woodstock and Greenwood, one; Peru, 7 Dixfield, Franklin plantation, Mexico, Roxbury, Byron, 8 Andover and Rumford, one; Newry, Grafton, Upton, 9 Lincoln plantation, Bethel, Gilead, Mason, Albany, Stone- 10ham, Hanover, Riley's Grant, number five range one, and 11 all territory not included in either of the above classes, 12 one.

The County of Penobscot shall choose sixteen repre- 2 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows: Bangor, three; 3 Dexter and Garland, one; Exeter, Corinna and Newport, 4 one; Plymouth, Etna, Dixmont and Newburg, one; 5 Corinth, Charleston and Bradford, one; Stetson, Levant, 6 Carmel and Kenduskeag, one; Hampden and Orrington, 7 one; Brewer and Veazie, one; Orono, Glenburn and 8 Hermon, one; Oldtown, Alton and Hudson, one; Edding- 9ton, Holden, Clifton, Bradley, Milford, Greenfield and 10 Greenbush, one; Lagrange, Argyle, Edinburg, Howland, 11 Maxfield, Mattamiscontis, Passadumkeag, Lincoln and

12 Enfield, one ; number one plantation, number two, Grand
 13 Falls plantation, Lowell, Burlington, number three south
 14 of Lee, Lakeville plantation, Carroll, Springfield, Lee,
 15 Prentiss and Webster plantation, one ; Chester, Winn,
 16 Mattawamkeag, Kingman, Drew plantation, Medway,
 17 Woodville plantation, Staceyville plantation, Patten, Mt.
 18 Chase and all other territory in Penobscot county not
 19 included in any other class, one.

The County of Piscataquis shall choose three repre-
 2 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows : Atkinson,
 3 Brownville, Medford, Milo, Orneville, Sebec, Williams-
 4 burg, Barnard, Bowerbank, number four range eight,
 5 numbers, four, five, six and seven range nine, one ; Fox-
 6 croft, Parkman and Sangerville, one ; Abbot, Blanchard,
 7 Greenville, Guilford, Willimantic, Kingsbury, Monson,
 8 Shirley, Wellington and all other territory not included
 9 in any other class, one.

The County of Sagadahoc shall choose four representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows : Richmond, Bow-
 3 doin and Perkins, one ; Bowdoinham, Topsham and West
 4 Bath, one ; Bath, one ; Woolwich, Arrowsic, George-
 5 town and Phippsburg, one.

The County of Somerset shall choose eight representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows : Fairfield, Smithfield
 3 and Mercer, one ; Norridgewock, Madison and Solon,
 4 one ; Cambridge, Harmony, Hartland, Ripley and St.
 5 Albans, one ; Pittsfield, Palmyra and Detroit, one ;
 6 Skowhegan, one ; Canaan, Cornville, Athens and
 7 Brighton, one ; Mayfield, Bingham, Moscow, Concord,
 8 Embden, Lexington, Dead River, Moose River, West
 9 Forks, Flagstaff, The Forks and all other plantations, one ;
 10 Starks, Anson and New Portland, one.

The County of Waldo shall choose seven representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows : Belfast, one ; Stock-
 3 ton, Prospect and Searsport, one ; Frankfort, Winterport
 4 and Monroe, one ; Burnham, Troy, Unity, Thorndike
 5 and Jackson, one ; Lincolnville, Islesborough, Northport

6 and Belmont, one ; Liberty, Montville, Searsmont and
 7 Palermo, one ; Freedom, Knox, Brooks, Waldo, Morrill
 8 and Swanville, one.

The County of Washington shall choose ten representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows : Eastport, one ;
 3 Calais, one ; East Machias, Alexander, Marshfield, Whit-
 4 neyville, Crawford, Wesley, numbers eighteen and nine-
 5 teen East Division, one ; Dennysville, Meddybemps,
 6 Lubec, Charlotte and Edmunds, one ; Pembroke, Perry
 7 and Robbinston, one ; Cherryfield, Steuben, Milbridge,
 8 Deblois, Beddington and Deveraux, one ; Machias,
 9 Columbia Falls, Columbia, Northfield and number
 10 eighteen middle division, one ; Whiting, Machiasport,
 11 Marion, Trescott, Cutler, Cooper and number fourteen
 12 east division, one ; Jonesport, Addison, Harrington,
 13 Jonesborough and Centerville, one ; Danforth, Princeton,
 14 Baileyville, Baring, Topsfield, Waite, number seven
 15 range two, number nine range four Codyville, Jackson
 16 Brook, Talmage, number twenty-one, north division
 17 plantations, and all territory not otherwise classed, one.

The County of York shall choose fifteen representatives,
 2 to be apportioned as follows : Biddeford, two ; Saco,
 3 one ; Kittery, one ; Newfield, Shapleigh and Acton, one ;
 4 Hollis and Buxton, one ; Dayton and Kennebunkport,
 5 one ; Elliott, for the years eighteen hundred and eighty-
 6 five, eighteen hundred and eighty-six, eighteen hundred and
 7 eighty-nine and eighteen hundred and ninety, one ; South
 8 Berwick, for the years eighteen hundred and eighty-three,
 9 eighteen hundred and eighty-four, eighteen hundred and
 10 eighty-seven, eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, eighteen
 11 hundred and ninety-one and eighteen hundred and ninety-
 12 two, one ; Waterborough and Limerick, one ; Sanford
 13 and Lebanon, one ; Lyman, Limington and Old Orchard,
 14 one ; Cornish and Parsonsfield, one ; Berwick and North
 15 Berwick, one ; York, for the years eighteen hundred and
 16 eighty-five, eighteen hundred and eighty-six, eighteen
 17 hundred and eighty-nine, eighteen hundred and ninety,
