STATE OF MAINE.

In SENATE, March 2, 1883.

Ordered, That the justices of the supreme judicial court be required to give to this Senate, according to the provisions of the constitution in this behalf, their opinion on the construction of the constitution relating to the apportionment of senators and representatives, upon this point, to wit:

Whether in making an apportionment of representatives amongst the several counties, as provided by the constitution, it is lawful for the Legislature to take into consideration the fractions left in making the apportionment for senators, and if an apportionment, where those fractions have been used, is constitutional.
