STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section twelve of chapter one hundred and forty of the revised statutes, relating to the accounts of the warden of the state prison.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twelve of chapter one hun-2 dred and forty of the revised statutes is amended 3 as follows: strike out the word "annually" after 4 the word "December" in the last sentence of said 5 section, and insert the words "March, June, 6 September and" before the word "December," 7 wherever it occurs in said section; also annex to 8 said section the sentence: "Vouchers for all expen-9 ditures shall be taken in duplicate, one copy of 10 each to be filed at the prison and the other with 11 the governor and council;" so that said section12 as amended shall read as follows:

Sect. 12. The warden shall not carry on or be 13 14 concerned in the business of trade and commerce 15 during his continuance in office; he shall reside 16 constantly within the precincts of the prison, and 17 shall have the care, custody and charge of the 18 prison, and of the convicts therein, in conformity 19 to their sentences, and of the lands, buildings, 20 machines, tools, stock, provisions, and of every 21 other kind of property belonging to or within the 22 precincts of the same. He shall be the treasurer 23 of the prison, receive, pay out, and be accountable :24 for all moneys granted for maintaining it, or 25 derived from the manufactures or other concerns 26 thereof; make in the books of the prison regular 27 entries of all its pecuniary and other concerns, 28 and, on the first day of March, June, September 29 and December of each year, he shall render to the 30 inspectors a fair account of all the expenses and 31 disbursements, receipts and profits of the prison, 32 with sufficient vouchers therefor, and a statement 33 of its general affairs, for the year then past, 34 including the number of convicts received and 35 discharged during the year, and the number 36 remaining; and a similar account and statement, 37 examined and approved by the inspectors; he shall 38 also render, under oath, on the first day of March, 39 June, September and December, to the governor 40 and council, and settle all his accounts with them 41 when they require it. Vouchers for all expendi-42 tures shall be taken in duplicate, one copy of each 43 to be filed at the prison and the other with the 44 governor and council.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when 2 approved.
