STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend sections one and two of chapter one hundred and twenty-two, Revised Statutes, relative to the Penalty for the Crime of Perjury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter one hundred

- 2 and twenty-two of the Revised Statutes is hereby
- 3 amended by striking out in the last clause thereof,
- 4 the words "less than two nor" so that said section
- 5 as amended shall read as follows:
 - 'SECT. 1. Whoever, when required to tell the
- 2 truth on oath or affirmation lawfully administered,
- 3 wilfully and corruptly swears or affirms falsely to
- 4 a material matter, in a proceeding before any court,

- 5 tribunal, or officer created by law, or in relation to
- 6 which an oath or affirmation is authorized by law,
- 7 is guilty of perjury; and whoever procures an-
- 8 other to commit perjury is guilty of subornation of
- 9 perjury; and shall be punished in either case, if
- 10 the perjury was committed in a trial of a capital
- 11 crime, by imprisonment for life or for any term of
- 12 years not less than ten, and if committed in any
- 13 other case, by imprisonment for not more than ten
- 14 years.'
 - Sect. 2. Section two of chapter one hundred
 - 2 and twenty-two of the Revised Statutes is hereby
 - 3 amended by striking out therefrom the words,
 - 4 "less than one, nor," so that the same shall read
 - 5 as follows:
 - 'SECT. 2. Whoever wilfully and corruptly en-
 - 2 deavors to incite or procure another to commit
 - 3 perjury, although it is not committed, shall be
 - 4 punished by imprisonment for not more than five
 - 5 years.'
