STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT for the protection of legitimate trade by actual residents of this state.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person or persons or firms who,

- 2 by themselves or their agents, shall bring into this
- 3 state a stock of goods, wares or merchandise, and
- 4 shall lease, hire or occupy any store, shop or room,
- 5 for the sale thereof, and shall remain in such town
- 6 or city for the purpose of such sale, for a space of
- 7 time less than one year, shall pay to the municipal
- 8 officers of such town or city, or to the treasurer
- 9 thereof, for the use of such town or city, as license
- 10 for such sale, a sum amounting to three (3) per

- 11 cent of the value of such stock of goods, wares 12 and merchandise, as shall appear by a schedule 13 which shall be furnished said municipal officers 14 or treasurer of such town or city where the goods 15 are exposed for sale.
 - SECT. 2. All subsequent invoices of goods, wares 2 or merchandise received by such persons or their 3 agents for sale shall be submitted to the municipal 4 officers or to the treasurer, and such persons or 5 agents shall pay to the said municipal officers or 6 treasurer the same percentage thereon, as provided 7 in section one of this bill, before such goods, wares 8 or merchandise shall be exposed for sale.
 - SECT. 3. If such stocks of goods, wares or mer2 chandise remain in such town or city on or after
 3 the first day of April of each year, thus being
 4 liable to ordinary taxation, such an amount of
 5 license, provided in sections one and two of this
 6 law, shall be refunded, as the assessors of such
 7 town or city may decide.
 - Sect. 4. In addition to the license for the sale 2 of goods, wares or merchandise, as are referred to 3 in the foregoing sections of this law, if such 4 goods, wares or merchandise are offered for sale 5 by public auction, then such parties or agents 6 shall pay to the treasurer of such town or city for

- 7 its use, for each and every day such auction shall
- 8 continue, the sum of five dollars, such payment to
- 9 be made before such auction sale shall commence.
 - SECT. 5. Refusal to comply with the provisions
- 2 of the foregoing sections of this law shall be pun-
- 3 ished by a fine of not less than five dollars or more
- 4 than twenty dollars for each and every day such
- 5 goods, wares or merchandise are exposed for sale.
- SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved
- 2 by the governor.
