## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT amending chapter two, sections forty and forty-one, Revised Statutes, relating to Record of Qualification of Justices of the Peace.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Chapter two, sections forty and
- 2 forty-one, of the Revised Statutes is hereby
- 3 amended so as to read as follows:
  - · 'Sect. 40. The Secretary of State shall, on the
- 5 first days of June and December, forward to the
- 6 registers of probate courts, judges of municipal
- 7 and police courts, clerks of United States courts,
- 8 and United States pension agents in the State, a
- 9 list of all justices of the peace, justices of the peace

10 and quorum, trial justices, and notaries public,
11 whose commissions are then in force, and the evi12 dence of whose qualifications has been filed in his
13 office within the six months next preceding the
14 time of forwarding such lists, which shall contain
15 the name and residence of every such officer, the
16 date of his commission, and the county or counties
17 for which he is commissioned, and he shall send at
18 the same times two copies of such lists to each of
19 the clerks of the State Courts.

'SECT. 41. The clerks of the State Courts shall 21 make a memorandum on such lists of the fact and 22 date of their reception, and either of such lists so 23 attested, or the certificate of such clerk under the 24 seal of his court shall be legal but not conclusive 25 evidence of the appointment and qualification of 26 such officers, and at the expiration of each decade 27 of years it shall be the duty of the clerk then in 28 office to have one set of such lists received during 29 the decade bound in a substantial manner.'
