## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend Section one hundred and twentyseven of Chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes, relating to School for the Deaf.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one hundred and twenty-seven of chapter

- 2 eleven of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended
- 3 by adding to the last line, the words, 'sent to the
- 4 American Asylum at Hartford, Connecticut, and
- 5 not exceed two hundred dollars a year for each
- 6 pupil sent to the Portland School for the Deaf at
- 7 Portland, Maine,' so that said section when
- 8 amended shall read as follows:

'SECT. 127. The Governor may draw his warrant 10 for the sums necessary to pay for the instruction 11 and support of such pupils as may be sent to said 12 institutions, respectively, pursuant to the preceding 13 sections, the same not to exceed one hundred and 14 seventy-five dollars a year for each pupil sent to 15 the American Asylum at Hartford, Connecticut, 16 and not exceed two hundred dollars a year for 17 each pupil sent to the Portland School for the 18 Deaf at Portland, Maine.'
