RESOLVE in favor of Hamlin Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars
2 be appropriated to aid in building a bridge at
3 Raphael Martin Stream, in Hamlin Plantation,
4 Aroostook County, and to be expended under the
5 direction of the governor and council. *Provided,*
6 that the inhabitants of said plantation build said
7 bridge to the acceptance of the governor and
8 council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Plantation of Hamlin having a large extent of roads and bridges to keep in repair, in proportion to their limited wealth, therefore the bridge on the main road, over Raphel Martin's Stream, so called, in said plantation is too expensive for them to re-build, and are in our opinion entitled to an appropriation in aid to build the same, the said bridge being of public necessity.
