### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT for the protection of Lobster Traps.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whoever takes up, or attempts to take up, or in

- 2 any way knowingly and willfully interferes with 3 any lobster trap, while set for use, in the season in
- 4 which it is lawful to prosecute the lobster fishery,
- 5 without the authority of the owners thereof, shall
- 6 be punished by a fine of not less than twenty nor
- 7 more than fifty dollars, to be recovered by in-
- 8 dictment or an action of debt, one-half to
- 9 the complainant and one-half to the county
- 10 where such proceedings are commenced;

11 provided, however, that no action shall be main-12 tained under this act unless the name of the owner

13 of all such traps shall be carved or branded in

14 legible letters, not less than three-fourths of an

15 inch in length, on all the buoys connected with

16 such traps.
