STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section five of chapter fifty-seven of the Revised Statutes in relation to the duties of Owners or Occupants of Grist Mill.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section five of said chapter is hereby 2 amended so that it shall read:

- 3 Sect. 5. The owner or occupant of every
- 4 grist mill shall keep scales and weights therein, to
- 5 weigh corn, grain and meal, when required; and
- 6 he shall well and sufficiently grind as required, ac-
- 7 cording to the nature, capacity and condition of his
- 8 mill, all grain brought to his mill for that purpose,
- 9 and in the order in which it shall be received; and

10 for neglecting or refusing to weigh the same when 11 required, or failing to grind the same in the order 12 received, or for taking more than lawful toll, he 13 shall be fined for every such offence in any sum not 14 less than ten nor exceeding fifty dollars at the distretion of the court; provided, that this section 16 shall not be so construed as to preclude the right 17 of any owner or occupant of any mill to enter into 18 any mutual agreement with any customer or customers 20 shall bring his or their grain to the mill for the 21 purpose of being ground.'
