STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section fifty-four of chapter seventy of the Revised Statutes, relating to secreting property with intent to defraud creditors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fifty-four of chapter seventy of the Re-2 vised Statutes is hereby amended so as to read as 3 follows:

⁵ SECT. 54. If a debtor, after notice of the filing 5 of a petition by or against him, or within four 6 months before, sells, removes, secretes or conceals 7 any property, money or effects belonging to his 8 estate, or any books, papers, documents or writ-9 ings relating thereto, or in any manner disposes

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10 of any part of his estate, with a view to defraud 11 his creditors, and evade the provisions of the in-12 solvent law, or to prevent the same from coming 13 to the hands of his assignees, except such as may 14 reasonably be expended for the support of himself 15 and family, not exceeding the amount specified in 16 the preceding section, he shall be punished by im-17 prisonment in jail not more than one year, or by 18 fine of not more than five hundred dollars.
