## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Brunswick."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. If the inhabitants of the town of 2 Brunswick accept the charter heretofore granted 3 to them, pursuant to section twenty-one of the 4 act referred to in the title to this act, and within 5 the time therein limited for such acceptance, they 6 may at the same meeting, but not afterwards, and 7 on a suitable article in the warrant calling such 8 meeting, fix the numbers of wards and aldermen 9 of the city of Brunswick; and said charter is 10 hereby amended only so far as to allow the

- 11 powers granted by this act to be seasonably ex-12 ercised.
  - Sect. 2. The vote under authority of the fore-
  - 2 going section shall be taken in such manner as the
  - 3 meeting may adopt, or in the ordinary manner of
  - 4 voting in said town in cases not requiring a written
  - 5 ballot.
    - Sect. 3. The number of wards shall not exceed
  - 2 the number of aldermen; and if their number shall
  - 3 be less, the number of aldermen chosen in each
  - 4 ward shall be equal, and any remaining aldermen
  - 5 shall be chosen at large in the manner provided in
  - 6 said charter; but the number of wards need not
- 7 exceed one, and the number of aldermen shall not
- 8 be less than three nor more than seven.
