STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

A minority of the Committee on Ways and Bridges, to which was referred the petition of Joseph Littlefield and others, praying for "an act to authorize the construction of a bridge over the tide waters of the Ogunquit River, in the town of Wells," have had the same under consideration and find that the Legislature of 1883, by chapter 246 of the Private and Special Laws of said year, enacted the following statute:

"Sect. 1. The inhabitants of the town of Wells are hereby authorized to construct a bridge over the tide waters of Ogunquit River, so called, in the town of Wells, at the eastern terminus of the town way leading from the county way to said river, whenever the inhabitants of said town shall so vote."

A minority of your Committee therefore report that sufficient authority already exists under said statute to lay out and maintain said way and bridge over said river, whenever said town shall determine that public convenience and necessity require it, and that no further legislation is required; therefore ask leave to report that the petitioner have leave to withdraw.
