STATE OF MAINE.

In House of Representatives, January 27, 1885.

Ordered, That the Committee on Legal Affairs be directed to inquire into the expediency and necessity of a law requiring the selectmen of the several towns in this State to keep a record of all persons moving into and from their respective towns, and so far as practicable the town to which they have removed, with a view of fixing the date of the length of time that such persons may have resided in the town moved from or into, and report by bill or otherwise.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

The Committee on Legal Affairs, to which was re-committed the Order of the Legislature relating to the keeping of a record of the selectmen of the several towns of the State, of all persons removing into or from their respective towns, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report that legislation thereon is inexpedient.
