STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the Pejepscot Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section one of chapter one hundred and nine of
2 the private and special laws of eighteen hundred
3 eighty-one, is hereby amended by inserting after
4 the word "Bath" in the eighth line, the words, 'or
5 any part thereof' and adding thereto the following
6 words: 'The towns and city shall have no right,
7 under any public or general law, to take water
8 from any aqueduct, pipe or reservoir of the com-
9 pany without its consent; but they may contract
10 with said company for a supply of water for fire

11 or other purposes, for a term of years; and such
12 contracts may be renewed or changed by mutual
13 consent,' so that said section, amended, shall read
14 as follows:

'SECT. 1. Charles J. Gilman, Benjamin Greene,
16 John Furbish, Eliphalet W. Dennison, Albert G.
17 Page and Samuel D. Bailey, with their associates
18 and successors, are hereby made an organization
19 by the name of the Pejepscot Water Company,
20 for the purpose of conveying to the towns of
21 Brunswick and Topsham and the city of Bath or
22 any part thereof, a supply of pure water for
23 domestic and municipal purposes, including the
24 extinguishment of fires, the supply of shipping
25 and the use of manufacturing establishments.
26 The towns and city shall have no right under any
27 public or general law, to take water from any
28 aqueduct, pipe or reservoir of the company without
29 its consent; but they may contract with said com-
30 pany for a supply of water for fire or other pur-
31 poses, for a term of years; and such contracts may
32 be renewed or changed by mutual consent.
