STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the City of Auburn

Resolved, That there be paid by the Treasurer of 2 State, out of the school funds of the current year, 3 to the city of Auburn, the sum of four hundred 4 seventy dollars and nine cents, it being a balance 5 equitably due said town as its proportion of the 6 school funds for the year eighteen hundred eighty-7 four.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The person who was elected Superintendent of Public Schools for the city of Auburn upon the third Monday of March, 1884, and who, by virtue of the office is secretary of the board of superintending school committee, declined to accept the position to which he was elected, and his successor was not chosen until about the middle of May following. During this time it became necessary to remove the office and its contents to another building; and if the usual blanks were sent they must have been mislaid or lost during said removal. The blank, at any rate, did not come to the hands of the superintending school committee of Auburn, and the result was that the returns were not received at the office of the State Superintendent of Schools until the fifth day of August, 1884, whereby the city of Auburn incurred a forfeiture of ten per centum of its State school funds.
