STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to require town and plantation officers to
keep a record of all persons moving into and from
their respective towns.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. That towns and plantations are
2 hereby authorized, at any regular meeting, by a
3 vote thereof, to require their assessors of taxes to
4 keep a record, with the date thereof, as near as
5 practicable, of all persons moving into and from
6 their respective towns and plantations during each
7 year, and on the first day of May make a return
8 of the same to the clerk thereof, who shall record
9 the same in a book to be kept for such purpose.

SECT. 2. The said clerks shall furnish copies of
2 such records upon payment of a reasonable fee.
