STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Portsmouth and Kittery Steam Ferry Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Augustus Stevenson, Charles 2 W. Cottle, Eleroy Cottle, George W. Muchemore, 3 Moses D. Moore, Stephen L. Marston, Richard H. 4 Waldron and George W. Green, their associates 5 and successors, be and they are hereby incorpo-6 rated and made a body politic by the name of the 7 Portsmouth and Kittery Steam Ferry Company, 8 and by that name may sue and be sued, prosecute 9 and defend to final judgment and execution, and

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10 be known and distinguished in all their acts and 11 proceedings, and shall be and hereby are invested 12 with all the powers and privileges, and made sub-13 ject to all the liabilities incident to corporations 14 of a similar nature.

SECT. 2. That said corporation be authorized to 2 carry on and operate a steam ferry for the purpose 3 of carrying teams of all kinds, such freight as is 4 not prohibited by law, also individual passen-5 gers, across the Piscataqua River, between, at, or 6 near the end of the navy yard bridge, in Navy 7 Yard Village, so called, in said Kittery and State 8 of Maine, and to some convenient point in Pep-9 perill's cove, in said Kittery, and Portsmouth and 10 Newcastle, in the State of New Hampshire.

SECT. 3. The capital stock of said corporation 2 shall not exceed thirty thousand dollars, and be 3 divided into shares of ten dollars each.

SECT. 4. Any five of the persons named in this 2 act may call the first meeting of said corporation 3 by giving to the other persons named herein a 4 written notice at least seven days previous thereof, 5 at which, or any subsequent meeting, officers may 6 be chosen and such by-laws, not repugnant to the 7 laws of this State, as may be thought proper may 8 be adopted.

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SECT. 5. Said corporation may purchase and hold 2 or lease real estate in the town of Kittery for the 3 purpose of slips, wharves, ferry tolls and waiting 4 rooms to the amount deemed requisite by the 5 directors.

SECT. 6. In case said corporation is unable to 2 agree with the owners of the land required and 3 necessary for the convenience of said company, the 4 York County Commissioners shall have power to 5 take the land, devote it to the purposes required 6 for said company, and assess the damages therefor 7 in the same manner and with the same powers as 8 in laying out highways, subject to the same rights 9 of appeal on the parts of land owners.

SECT. 7. Said corporation is hereby authorized 2 to drive the piles deemed necessary by its mana-3 gers, for slips, wharves and buildings to be used 4 in connection with the ferry, upon such privilege 5 as it may buy, lease, or in any way receive and 6 occupy for landings in said Kittery.

SECT. 8. This act shall be void unless the ferry 2 is put in actual operation between Portsmouth and 3 Kittery at the point or points herein named, in 4 the town of Kittery, within three years from 3 the passage hereof.

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SECT. 9. The Legislature may alter, amend or 2 repeal this act whenever in their opinion the pub-3 lic good shall require.

SECT. 10. This act shall take effect from and 2 after its passage.
