STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to authorize Charles E. Wilson and others
to Navigate Pushaw Lake by Steam.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Charles E. Wilson, Albert F. Smith,
2 H. H. Crocker, Julius H. Crocker, Edward Hop-
3 kins, J. Fields Murry, all of Bangor, their associ-
4 ates and assigns, are hereby vested with the exclu-
5 sive right, against all persons, of employing and
6 navigating every kind of boat or water craft, pro-
7 pelled by steam, for hire or as common carrier, on
8 Pushaw Lake, in the county of Penobscot for the
9 term of ten years from the approval of this act.

SECT. 2. It shall be the duty of the said Wilson,
2 his associates and assigns, to furnish adequate,

3 reasonable accommodation for the ordinary travel
4 over said lake in the summer season; and if they
5 shall fail to do so after reasonable notice, or if the
6 travel shall so increase as to require another boat,
7 which they shall not supply, the exclusive right
8 aforesaid shall terminate.

SECT. 3. Any person who shall use or employ on
2 said lake, any boat or water craft propelled by
3 steam, for hire or as common carrier, without being
4 authorized by the said Wilson, his associates or
5 assigns, shall forfeit for each offence not less than
6 fifty and not more than two hundred dollars, to be
7 recovered by and for the use of said Wilson, his
8 associates and assigns, in an action of debt.

SECT. 4. A reasonable toll is hereby authorized
2 for transportation of persons and merchandise
3 across said lake, the rate to be established by the
4 county commissioners of Penobscot county from
5 time to time as they may determine.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
