# AN ACT to incorporate The Blethen House Water Works Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. William D. Blethen, his associates,

- 2 successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated,
- 3 and made a body politic, by the name of The
- 4 Blethen House Water Works Company, for the
- 5 purpose of supplying the inhabitants of the vil-
- 6 lage of Dover, in the County of Piscataquis, with
- 7 pure fresh water.
  - SECT. 2. Said company is hereby authorized to
- 2 complete and maintain an aqueduct from the land
- 3 in said Dover, conveyed by H. L. Brockway to

4 William D. Blethen, by deed dated December 5 twenty-fourth, eighteen hundred and eighty-three 6 and recorded in Piscataquis Registry of Deeds, 7 volumn eighty-eight, page three hundred and 8 sixty-six, to the village of said Dover, and from 9 thence to such parts of said village as may be 10 convenient or necessary, to furnish to the inhabitants thereof a supply of fresh water from said 12 aqueduct.

SECT. 3. Said company is hereby authorized to 2 complete and maintain said aqueduct through the 3 lands where it has already been constructed, and 4 across and within the limits of town and county 5 roads, in suitable places therefor, and shall have 6 all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all 7 the duties and liabilities of similar corporations, 8 as defined by the laws of the State.

SECT. 4. Persons claiming damages to lands or 2 otherwise, by reason of the construction of said 3 aqueduct, if unable to agree with said company 4 upon the amount thereof, may have the same determined, at any time within three years, by the 6 county commissioners, in the same manner that 7 damages are determined for land taken by rail-8 road corporations.
