STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section sixty-five of chapter
seventy of the Revised Statutes, relating to the
payment of fees in Insolvency.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section sixty-five of chapter seventy
2 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out all after the word "estates" in the third line
4 of said section, and adding thereto 'and if there are not
5 sufficient assets for the payment of the fees and
6 costs, the person upon whose petition the warrant
7 is issued shall pay the same, and the court may
8 issue an execution against him to compel payment

9 to the register,' so that said section as amended
10 shall read as follows:

'SECT. 65. The fees of all officers, the compen-
12 sation of assignees, and of judges and registers of
13 probate, under this chapter, shall be established by
14 the supreme judicial court, and shall be paid out
15 of the estates; and if there are not sufficient assets
16 for the payment of the fees and costs, the person
17 upon whose petition the warrant is issued shall pay
18 the same, and the court may issue an execution
19 against him to compel payment to the register.'

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to pending
2 proceedings.
