## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to abolish Arrest and Imprisonment for Debt, except in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No person shall be arrested or im-
- 2 prisoned on any writ or mesne process in any civil
- 3 action or proceeding, or on any execution or final
- 4 process issued on any judgment rendered in any
- 5 civil action or proceeding, except as herein pro-
- 6 vided.
- Sect. 2. The prohibition of arrest and imprison-
- 2 ment in section one of this act shall not apply to
- 3 any capias or other process issued to procure the
- 4 attendance of any person as witness, juror or offi-

- 5 cer of court, in any legal proceeding; or to any 6 interlocutory decrees or orders; or to commitments 7 for contempt; or to the accused party or respond-8 ent in bastardy proceedings under the statutes of 9 the State; or to the collection or disposal of pub-10 lie taxes, in any mode or modes provided or to be 11 provided by law.
  - SECT. 3. No writ or mesne process, or execution 2 or final process, issued after this act takes effect, 3 shall run against the body contrary to the pro4 visions of this act. All processes in force at the 5 time this act takes effect may be enforced according to the tenor thereof. The right to attach and 7 dispose of property or interest therein in any mode 8 or modes, is not hereby abridged or affected.
  - SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and become 2 law on the first day of June, in the year of our 3 Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

#### MAJORITY REPORT.
