STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT relating to the Support of Paupers who
have lost their settlement by living in unincorporated places.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Whenever a person having a pauper settlement
2 in a town loses such settlement by virtue of the
3 provisions of section three of chapter twenty-four
4 of the Revised Statutes, relief shall be furnished,
5 and towns furnishing such relief shall be reim-
6 bursed by the State as provided in section twenty-
7 nine of said chapter, in case of paupers having no
8 legal settlement in the State, and not having lived
9 in the town furnishing such relief.
