AN ACT relating to the Support of Paupers who have lost their settlement by living in unincorporated places.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whenever a person having a pauper settlement
2 in a town loses such settlement by virtue of the
