# STATE OF MAINE.

## RESOLVE relating to United States Appropriations for Indians.

Whereas, Believing that the education of Indians,2 their voluntary citizenship in the United States,3 will most justly, quickly and economically solve4 the Indian problem, therefore

Resolved, That the Senators and Representatives 6 in Congress be and they hereby are requested to 7 aid in the passage of resolutions solemnly pledging 8 the faith of the Nation to the Indian policy em-9 bodied in the following principles:

First, That the unpaid sum pledged for educa-11 tional purposes by the government as part payment 12 for the cession of lands by Indians be appropriated 13 for the purchase of stock, farming implements, 14 tools, etc., for Indian manual labor schools.

Second, That so much of the net proceeds of the 16 sale of public lands as may be necessary shall be 17 set apart for the purpose of creating a permanent 18 fund for the education of Indians.

Third, That lands in severalty making their titles 20 inalienable for twenty-five years, and United States 21 citizenship may be granted at once to all Indians 22 who so desire.

Fourth, That the legal personality of all Indians 24 may be granted, and that protection of law may 25 be given them, as it is to all other races within 26 these United States.

Fifth, That the civilization of Indians may be 28 hastened by providing for and rewarding their 29 civilized industries.

Sixth, That the salaries of Indian agents be suffi-31 ciently increased to secure good men of large 32 capacity and business experience, and to retain 33 them in service.

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to 35 transmit a copy of the foregoing resolutions to 36 each of the Senators and Representatives in Con-37 gress from this State.
