STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section nineteen of chapter two of the Revised Statutes, relating to the expenditure of money in excess of the amount appropriated in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled as follows:

Section nineteen of chapter two of Revised

- 2 Statutes be amended by striking out all in said
- 3 section following the word "reimbursement," and
- 4 inserting instead thereof, the words, 'any such
- 5 agent or officer, who shall violate the provisions of
- 6 this section, shall, upon conviction, be fined a sum
- 7 equal to such excess of appropriation by him ex-
- 8 pended, and imprisoned in the discretion of the

9 court. All prosecutions under this section shall 10 be by indictment, and the fine enure to the State,' 11 so that said section shall read as follows:

'SECT. 19. No agent or officer of the State, or 13 of any department thereof, whose duty it is to ex14 pend money under an appropriation by the Legis15 lature, and who exceeds in his expenditure said 16 appropriation, shall have any claim for reimburse17 ment. Any such agent or officer, who shall violate 18 the provisions of this section, shall, upon convic19 tion, be fined a sum equal to such excess of appro20 priation by him expended, and imprisoned in the 21 discretion of the court. All prosecutions under 22 this section shall be by indictment, and the fine 23 enure to the State.'
