## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Bingham and Moose River Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Ira H. Randall, J. Manchester
- 2 Haynes, S. J. Walton, Alonzo F. Adams, Isaac
- 3 Newton, George Savage and John Webster, their
- 4 associates, successors and assigns, are hereby
- 5 created a body politic, by the name of the Bing-
- 6 ham and Moose River Telephone and Telegraph
- 7 Company, with all the powers, rights and priv-
- 8 ileges, and subject to all the duties and obligations
- 9 granted and prescribed by the general laws of

- 10 this State, relating to corporations. Said corpora-
- 11 tion shall have the right to locate, construct, main-
- 12 tain and operate lines of telephone and telegraph
- 13 from some point in the town of Bingham, through
- 14 any intervening town or plantation, to the Forks
- 15 of the Kennebec River, and from thence to Moose
- 16 River Village, or to any intermediate point, and
- 17 from the Forks to some point in the town of
- 18 Shirley.
  - SECT. 2. Said company shall have the right,
  - 2 within the limits aforesaid, to locate, construct
  - 3 and maintain its lines upon and along any public
  - 4 way, railroad, bridge or private lands, but in such
  - 5 manner as not to incommode or endanger the
  - 6 customary use of such way, road or bridge, with
- 7 the right to cut down trees, remove obstacles,
- 8 when necessary, within the limits aforesaid, except
- 9 ornamental, fruit or shade trees, and with the
- 10 power to establish and collect tolls on said line.
  - SECT. 3. If the land of any individual or cor-
  - 2 poration is taken under this act, and the parties
  - 3 can not agree on the damages occasioned thereby,
  - 4 they shall be estimated, secured and paid in the
  - 5 manner provided in case of land taken for rail-
  - 6 roads.

Sect. 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized

- 2 to connect its line or lines with those of any other
- 3 company, or to sell or lease its line either before
- 4 or after completion, to any other telephone or
- 5 telegraph company, upon such terms as may be
- 6 mutually agreed upon, which sale or lease shall be
- 7 binding upon the parties, or to purchase or lease
- 8 any other line or lines of telegraph or telephone,
- 9 upon such terms and conditions as may be
- 10 mutually agreed upon.
  - Sect. 5. The amount of the capital stock shall
  - 2 be fixed by vote of the corporation, but not to
  - 3 exceed the amount that may, from time to time,
  - 4 be considered to be necessary for the purposes
  - 5 herein specified, but not exceeding ten thou-
  - 6 sand dollars, and said corporation may purchase,
  - 7 hold, sell and convey real estate and personal
  - 8 property necessary for the purposes contemplated
  - 9 in this charter.
    - Sect. 6. Any one of the corporators named in
  - 2 this act may call the first meeting of this com-
  - 3 pany by mailing a written notice to each of the
  - 4 other corporators, seven days at least, before the
  - 5 day of meeting, naming the time, place and pur-
  - 6 poses of such meeting; and at such meeting a
  - 7 president, secretary, treasurer and directors may

- 8 be chosen, by-laws adopted, and any corporate
- 9 business transacted.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when ap-
