STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to restore the Salary of the Clerk of Courts of Penobscot County as provided in chapter seventy-one, Public Laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. From and after January first, 2 eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, the Clerk of 3 Courts of Penobscot County shall receive an 4 annual salary of fifteen hundred dollars and an 5 additional allowance of eight hundred dollars per 6 annum for clerk hire. Said sum shall be in full 7 compensation for the performance of all duties

8 required of him by law, including those performed
9 by him as clerk of the county commissioners or
10 by a clerk *pro tempore* employed by him, under
11 section seven, chapter seventy-eight. He shall
12 render an account of all fees of office as required
13 by law, be responsible for the same whether col-
14 lected by him or not, and pay the whole amount to
15 the treasurer of said county for the use thereof.
16 One clerk employed by him shall be known as the
17 deputy clerk, and sworn as such, and shall give to
18 the clerk a bond for his honesty and the faithful
19 discharge of his duties.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
