STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of Fish from
Webb's Pond, its tributaries and outlet, in Franklin
County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are prohibited hereby
2 to take fish of any kind from the tributaries of
3 Webb's Pond for the term of six years.

SECT. 2. The close time for the outlet of
2 Webb's Pond is hereby extended so as to include
3 the month of September in each year, in addition
4 to the general close time as now provided by law.

SECT. 3. Any person violating the provisions of
2 the foregoing sections of this act, shall be liable
3 to a fine of five dollars for each fish so taken, to
4 be recovered on complaint before any trial justice
5 in the county of Franklin, one-half to the com-
6 plainant and one-half to the town where the offence
7 is committed.

SECT. 4. All persons are prohibited hereby from
2 taking fish of any kind, in any manner, through
3 the ice in Webb's Pond, in the town of Weld, for
4 the term of six years.

SECT. 5. Any person violating the provisions of
2 section four of this act shall be liable to a fine of
3 ten dollars and a further penalty of one dollar for
4 each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint
5 before any trial justice in the county of Franklin,
6 one-half to the complainant and one-half to the
7 town of Weld.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
