RESOLVE in favor of Frederick Munson.

---

*Resolved,* That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of two hundred dollars to be paid to Frederick Munson of Calais in compensation for loss of personal property while serving as an officer of the State. Said loss of property being on account of the faithful discharge of his duties as such officer.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Frederick Munson, now of Calais, was a game warden in the town of Wesley in July, 1885. For attending to his duty as such officer a torch was applied to his home, which, together with all his furniture and clothing, was consumed. His crops were pulled from the ground, his fruit trees were girdled, his cow was poisoned and indignities of every description were heaped upon him. Munson and his family were actually driven from the town of Wesley, with nothing left them but the clothing they had on their persons.

For the crimes committed one of the incendiaries has been sentenced to twelve years in the State Prison. The other one is now in the county jail awaiting his sentence.
