RESOLVE in favor of Bridges in Island Falls,
Aroostook County.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars in aid of re-building the bridge across Fish Stream, in the town of Island Falls, Aroostook County, the same to be expended under direction of an agent to be appointed by the Governor and Council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Island Falls has five bridges to maintain that are over fifty feet in length and one that is more than two hundred feet long. These bridges are all public necessities and the inhabitants are unable to make the necessary repairs ; and the bridge across Fish Stream must be rebuilt the present season.

This town has 52 polls and a valuation of only \$47,229.
