STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine Industrial School
for Girls:

Resolved, That there be, and is hereby appropriated from the funds in the State Treasury, the sum of seven thousand dollars, for the use of the Maine Industrial School for Girls, at Hallowell, to meet the current expenses for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-seven; and seven thousand dollars to meet the current expenses for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-eight; and the sum additional of one thousand dollars, to aid in the erection of outbuildings, and procuring a better supply of water.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Maine Industrial School.

Since the appropriations of 1885 and 1886 were granted, the completion of a second new building, and its occupancy, with the employment of a double force of matrons, housekeepers, and teachers, makes the present expenses of the Industrial School very nearly double what they were in these years; added to this, the fact that there is an increase of commitments to the Institution, and the Trustees show an imperative need of an appropriation to aid in erection of out-buildings and procuring a water supply, the Committee on Education report this resolve.
