STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter forty-four,
relating to Peddlers' Licenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

That section two of chapter forty-four of the Re-
vised Statutes of eighteen hundred eighty-three is
hereby amended by striking out all of said section
following the word "free," in the eighth line thereof,
so that said section as amended shall read as fol-
lows:

'SECT. 2. The county commissioners may license
for the purposes aforesaid, any person who satisfies
them that he sustains a good moral character, and
has been for five years a citizen of the United

11 States; such licenses expire in one year from their
12 date and are not transferable; and the license, shall
13 pay therefor if he is to offer to sell by retail, ten
14 dollars, if by wholesale, twenty-five dollars; but
15 soldiers of the State disabled in the recent war of
16 the rebellion shall have their licenses free.'
