STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section eight, chapter ninety-one, Re-
vised Statutes, relating to Liens on Vessels.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section eight, chapter ninety-one of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the
3 following words, viz: Commencing in the middle of the
4 eighth line of said section after the word "attachment"
5 and striking out, "and whoever furnishes labor or mate-
6 rials for a vessel after it is launched, or for its repair, has
7 a lien on it therefor, to be enforced by attachment within
8 four days after the work is completed," so that said sec-
9 tion, amended, shall read as follows :—

‘SECT 8. Whoever furnishes labor or materials for
11 building a vessel has a lien on it therefor, which may be
12 enforced by attachment thereof, within four days after it

13 is launched ; but if the materials and labor have been so
14 furnished by virtue of a contract not fully completed at
15 the time of the launching of the vessel, the lien may be
16 enforced within four days after such contract has been
17 completed. He also has a lien on the materials furnished,
18 before they become part of the vessel, which may be en-
19 forced by attachment ; and the owner of any dry dock or
20 marine railway, used for any vessel, have a lien on said
21 vessel for the use of said dock or railway, to be enforced
22 by attachment within four days after the last day in which
23 the same is used or occupied by said vessel.
